4th of July Parade—Letter from Jim Chandler, Galesville

You could feel it in the air, not just the heat and humidity that made the American Flags that line Main Street hang heavy, but something really special, the annual Independence Day Parade was about to begin. Mom, Dad, the kids, longtime residents of Galesville and new neighbors begin to congregate as they briefly stop to greet neighbors and friends. As everyone make their way to their traditional viewing spot, eyes look to the sky and then down Main Street, talk is of whether the parade or the rain will arrive first. The 4th of July Parade is one of those special days in Galesville that residents look forward to with anticipation. It is a throwback to a simpler time when a parade was a way to show your pride in the community and celebrate how wonderful it is to live in the USA.

As 1:00 o'clock arrives, it's not long until the familiar sound of the sirens of the Galesville Volunteer Fire Crew and the Galesville



Station of the AA County Fire Department lead the way.

This year's parade was much like many of the past, old cars and tractors, organizations and politicians with a good showing from the equestrians properly placed at the end.

Tractors from the past, now prized possessions of their owners, occasionally backfire as they make their annual appearance. Our parade always has a good representation of tractors from the last century and occasion-

ally a modern tractor will make an appearance as a reminder that some of our neighbors still make a living off the land or the water.

Cars similar to those that were once uncommon to our waterside community now ride down Main Street to the delight of some of our long-time residents and provides an opportunity to remind us of how a horse and wagon was more likely to be seen on Main Street than an automobile.

The only thing that can top watching the annual Galesville Independence Day Parade is being in the parade. Our parade welcomes just about anyone who has something of interest to share with our community.

This year's winner of the best float was a salute to the Emma Giles. The steamboat Emma Giles, always a crowd favorite, was a mainstay of commerce in Galesville for many years moving people and goods to and from Galesville by water.

Not long after the end of the parade had passed did the skies open up and wash Main Street clean of the evidence



that 25 horses had ever been there.

This year's parade like many of the past, was sponsored by the Galesville Heritage Society and organized by **Bill Whitman** and **Justin Novak.** We wish to offer sincere thanks and recognition of their hard work and volunteer spirit.
