## Galesville Heritage Museum Holiday Events





advocacy and awarenessbuilding programs to make the water more swimmable. fishable and clean.

Previously, he was executive director of the Annapolis Maritime Museum, where he established an award-winning environmental education program for AA County public school students.

Jeff has worked with the Captain Avery Museum and helped produce the exhibit "The Story of Stores" at the Galesville Heritage Museum. He was appointed to the Citizens Advisory Committee for the Chesapeake Bay Program and to the Annapolis Heritage Commission.

Jeff is a singer and songwriter and founding member of "Them Eastport Oyster Boys." As the Poet Laureate of Eastport, he has published numerous pieces in narrative

verse inspired by the history and heritage of Annapolis and the Chesapeake Bay. His children's book, Chessie, The Sea Monster That Ate Annapolis, was published in 1990. A new novella for middle schoolers, Charles Carroll's Cats, is slated for release on Maryland Day in 2017.
