
# Winter Dinner Speaker

David Gendell will discuss the history of the Thomas Point Shoal Lighthouse. Gendell is the author of the first and only book on the iconic 1875 screw pile-style lighthouse, located in the Chesapeake Bay at Annapolis. His presentation includes images, charts,



stories, and history covering the point, earlier iterations of the lighthouse, the current structure, and its noteworthy keepers. Gendell is also the co-founder of SPINSHEET Magazine and PROPTALK Magazine.
