Celebrating a Local Legend Sue Dixon Hines to be Inducted into 2025 McDaniel College Athletic Hall of Fame

Sue attended McDaniel, (formerly Western Maryland College) from 1945 to 1949, beginning her college journey at just 16 years old. A true pioneer and multisport athlete, she played field hockey, basketball, volleyball, softball and tennis, earning her coveted letter "M" by competing on multiple varsity teams. In 1946, she was named to the All- Star field hockey team – a highlight in a remarkable collegiate athletic career. Sue took great pride in earning the points required to receive her letter, a symbol of her dedication and excellence.

Her achievements didn't stop on the field. Sue graduated as valedictorian of the class of 1949, showcasing her academic brilliance alongside her athletic accomplishments.

Following college, Sue dedicated herself to education, teaching mathematics for two years and then spending 25 years as a teacher of the deaf.

Beyond her professional contributions, she was an active member of the Galesville community serving on the WRIA board of directors and organizing the 4th of July parade for many years. Now, at 96 years young, Sue still lives here in Galesville – an enduring symbol of commitment and community spirit.
