Maryland Day Celebration of Galesville's Hunters and Fishers

On March 27th, Chuck Dixon was back pound-netting...in miniature. He created a perfect step-by-step illustration of the fishing method used on the bay since George Washington's time.

He was on hand to describe the way fish are gathered into a "pound," a sort of pen of netting, and then scooped into a waiting boat. He and Eric Steinlein put together a fascinating display of antique tools used in hunting and fishing and trapping around the West River. Both are experts and were keen to share their knowledge. Young and old were invited to touch the old needles used to mend sails and decoys that lured ducks.

This display had been in the works for two years since pandemic limitations on attendance made it hard to enjoy last year. This time, the eager crowd found plenty to learn about this area of our heritage.

What Is a Shay?

The Galesville Heritage Museum has a new artifact, thanks to the sleuthing of the Museum Committee member Susan Cosden. It is an early 20th century shay built by Galesville's blacksmith Joe Bean. It is a one-horse carriage that was used to carry just one or max two passengers. It is essentially, a horse-drawn chair. That is how it got its name. "Shay" is the Americanization of the French word "chaise" which means "chair," (think "chaise lounge"). Sometimes, a shay was called a "whisky" because it was a light and fast carriage that could "whisk" around town.
