Jeff Beard's Presentation: Hemingway to Hepburn: How America Created Sportfishing Yachts

Highlighting the Heritage of Wheeler, Egg Harbor, Rybovich & Chris-Craft Yachts



Hemingway deserves credit for helping to popularize sport fishing in the 1930s and 1940s, while writing Islands in the Stream and articles for Outdoor Life and Motor Boating.

Watercraft capable of venturing on big waters, conquering squall-driven waves, running tricky inlets, handling predictably in adverse conditions, of sheltering crew for rest and respite, must have a blue water sailor's soul and build.

Along with the Horatio Alger stories of builders of sport fishermen, some of the more colorful owners of these boats will be discussed. Because the Chesapeake Bay and mid-Atlantic were storied fishing grounds, examples of these vintage boats can be found on local waters.

(We will also reveal why Timid Tuna is berthed on the Rhode River)


